36	SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS SCAT Update
37	Mr. Liesenfelt reviewed a presentation with the following discussion points:
38	 Fixed route ridership is down everywhere, not just Brevard.
39	• Bus Stop Update: City of Titusville will get 11 shelters and 5 benches throughout
40	the city. SCAT will install and Titusville will maintain them. SCAT/municipalities

41 are looking at other areas as well – Cocoa, Rockledge, Palm Bay, Melbourne, West
42 Melbourne, etc. The TPO will fund a bus stop assessment study. During the last
43 survey (2013-2014), 89% of stops did not meet ADA guidelines.

- Budgets are being released today it appears SCAT budget is status quo, no change.
- New vehicles (buses, paratransit, commuter vans) are coming.
- State Safety Inspection underway.
- Transit Development Plan public input meetings will be held on August 2nd and August 3rd.
- Transit Planner position was filled as well as the new Safety Coordinator.

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Mobility Week Presentation

Joe Santiago with FDOT presented the concept of Mobility Week – a compilation of events that promotes other modes of transportation and complete streets. The first Mobility Week was held last year. Events such as helmet fittings, bicycling events (bike to work, etc.), Halloween events that included children and safety messages, training (bicycle) events, commute challenge and transit events (free bus rides, demonstration of how to put your bike on the bus and 2,500 giveaways). This year, FDOT is working on about 15 different events and is also looking for partnerships willing to participate and hold events for Mobility Week.

Wendy Ellis introduced the new "Ride with Jim" program. The events encourage people to ride a bus and share coffee and conversation with Jim Liesenfelt. A bus will pick up participants and take them to a local Bagel 13 and during the trip, Jim will discuss aspects of SCAT. Wendy also presented some examples of SCAT commercials.

Abby Rex, Public Involvement Officer with the Space Coast TPO, is working on two events planned that will also coincide with Mobility Week. The Rail Trail opening in Titusville and they have partnered with Victoria Landing, Eau Gallie/Melbourne and Legacy Club to host a walk-through history through Eau Gallie and then have a reception afterward on a deck overlooking the river. Also reaching out to business partners to see if they are interested in sharing the message and provide incentives to participate in Mobility Week. Kim Smith is also planning Trunk or Treats again.
